
Xandra Blackburn

Lyn Rackley

At first glance everyday events that shape our lives emerge in Lyn's works. On a deeper level, Lyn likes to create an atmosphere charged with other possibilities dealing with the many layers of our lives, meaning within meaning. To Lyn, this way of expressing herself presents the abstract within reality.

Lyn's choice of subject matter includes people doing everyday activities, seascapes, landscapes, old buildings, and things outside that show interesting textures and value patterns. Lyn's present choice of mediums includes watercolor and oil. She is also exploring fabric art and jewelry making. Her most recent works are inspired by the area around her two homes, one in

Washington and the other in Arizona. Lyn's work is realistic, executed in a loose style, with emphasis on the abstract qualities of recognizable objects. The atmospheric qualities created by weather and natural light also intrigue the artist and find their way into her paintings.

Living in varied locations and traveling has influenced her work as new people and experiences allowed for personal growth as well as artistic expansion. The creative process is an important portion of Lyn's life.

She has received several awards for works from regional and national shows. This recognition comes in the form of acceptance to annual juried shows, awards received from first place to honorable mention and the privilege of being a former signature member of the Florida Watercolor Society and the Pastel Society of North Florida. As an illustrator Lyn has eight published children's books, greeting cards for Centaworld and posters for Northwest Florida State College (NWFSC). She worked as an Art Professor at NWFSC from 1991 to 2012. Lyn presently lives in Birch Bay, WA and Green Valley, AZ. She is married and has one son who lives in Texas.
