NOVEMBER'S PRESENTATION ZENTANGLES BY DIANE BERG

Zentangles are a meditative and creative practice that revolves around the philosophy that "Anything is possible one stroke at a time" and "There are no mistakes". The basic principle is for you to relax and engage in a drawing using easy-to-learn marks, known as tangles, to make patterns which, as confidence is gained in mark making, these tangles can be combined to make artworks.

I started learning to make tangles about the time they became popular in 2000 and have never really stopped learning new ones. I often use them on little note cards I send to family and friends.

The Zentangle philosophy of "There are no mistakes" is a lesson I really

need to practice all the time, over and over again. When a mistake happens, the reaction should not be disappointment, anger, or discouragement but rather to embrace it and see it as a learning opportunity. If I don't make mistakes I am not learning. The art and joy is in the doing, not the artifact. I always need to work on that.
